### OBITUARY OF AUG. BRAHEE

Well Known Resident of This Section  
of the County Dies at the  
Age of 67.

We made brief mention in this Department last week of the death of August Brahee, prominent West Union agriculturist, who passed away at the family home Wednesday, April 6, 1922, at the age of 67 years, 9 months and 20 days. His death came as a severe shock to his family and many friends and caused much sorrow throughout the entire community.

The late August Brahee was born in Lekaa Parish, Skaraborg's Län, Sweden, June 16, 1854 and was married in his native land to Anna Stina Johnson on November 24, 1876. They came to America in the year 1882, coming directly west to Carver county, where they have resided ever since. Mr. Brahee became prominent in the West Union community, his opinion being highly valued and often sought. He was a man of sterling integrity, an upright and honorable man and citizen. He was a devoted and ever thoughtful husband and father and his family has suffered an irreparable loss in his passing.

He is survived by his devoted wife and five children, namely: Mrs. Wm. Anderson, Mrs. Gilbert Larson and Oscar and Walter Brahee of this community and Mrs. Alvin Stromberg of Graceville, to all of whom our heartfelt sympathy is extended. Besides the above he is survived by 16 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren.

The funeral took place from the West Union Swedish Lutheran church on Monday afternoon, April 10, and was very largely attended. The services were conducted by the Rev. Mr. Nelson and the following acted as pall-bearers: Alfred Anderson, John Anderson, Swan Wanquist, Frank Johnson, John Lundgren and Claus Anderson. Interment was in the West Union cemetery.

Those from a distance at the funeral were Mrs. Alvin Stromberg, Graceville; Swan Johnson and son Louis of St. Paul; A. Lofgren and Gustaf Johnson of Hopkins; Fred Dahl of Aberdeen, S. D.; Oscar Vig of Hawkins, Wis.; Alf Land of Minneapolis.

### GRANDMA BRAHEE 1934 DIED IN 88TH YEAR

Mrs. Annastina Brahee passed away at her home here last Saturday morning, February 26th. She had not enjoyed the best of health for some time but it was only for the last month or so that she was confined to bed. She was at her death 87 years and 5 days old. Only last Monday she celebrated her birthday.

She was born in Blitarra Parish, Westergotland, Sweden, on Feb. 19, 1847. She was confirmed in 1863 and was married to August Brahee on November 26, 1876. They came to America on June 2, 1882, and came directly to Carver and in the spring of 1883 settled on the farm now owned by O. A. Brahee. This union was blessed with nine children, four who died in infancy. Mr. Brahee died April 6, 1922.

Mrs. Brahee leaves to mourn her decease five children as follows: Mrs. Wm. (Freda) Anderson, Oscar, Mrs. Gilbert (Anita) Larson, and Walter, all of West Union, and Mrs. Alvin (Adal) Stromberg, of Graceville, also one brother, Swan Johnson, of St. Paul, and one half-sister, Mrs. A. L. Skoog, of Sweden, also 21 grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.

Mrs. Brahee has been a true and faithful member of the West Union church for fifty years and she knew the hardships the early settlers had to contend with. She was always a cheerful and contented woman and well versed in conversation, and she was just as spry and alert almost to the very end. She will not only be missed by her immediate family but by a large circle of other relatives and friends.

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon at the West Union church.—Delle Plains Herald.
